Breaking Free: Day by Day

Jesus came that we might be healed, made whole. Therefore, I must confess that I get quite irritated when someone is told that they should just let "sleeping dogs lie" in certain areas of their lives! (If the Lord has guided you to seek healing for something, then you should seek it.) Healing comes in different shapes and sizes, just like people. Jesus wants everything healed in us, not just certain areas of our lives.

Recently a young woman was at the Glennon House who felt led by the Lord to receive healing for emotional and sexual abuse. She related that she had been told, by a well meaning friend, that she probably shouldn't dredge up all of that stuff from her past. What was the purpose of revisiting those horrific experiences? I wanted to reply to the friend, "Because our past has the propensity to mold who we become, if areas of hurt and unforgiveness remain unhealed it can be detrimental to our present. By inviting Jesus into those wounds, from our past, we have the opportunity to be healed and made whole."

I sat pondering what the young woman's friend had said to her. I wondered if that same friend would have told her not to seek healing if she'd been diagnosed with Cancer? Of course not! So why shouldn't the woman seek healing from emotional and sexual abuse? Just as Jesus wants His children healed from Cancer; He also wants the young woman healed from the emotional and sexual abuse. Jesus came that we might have the *whole enchilada* when it comes to being healed and made whole! This means including all the ingredients of wholeness: body, mind, and spirit!

When you want to make enchiladas you go to the grocery store to buy the ingredients. Once you get the ingredients home and place them on the counter, they are still simply ingredients. It isn't until you cook what needs to be cooked, mix together what needs to be mixed together, and then place all the ingredients inside the tortilla that you have an enchilada. Technically, (sorry for all of you carb conscious people) without putting the ingredients inside a tortilla you don't truly have the *whole enchilada!* Plus, they just don't taste as good!

The same holds true for healing. Without addressing all of the "ingredients" of a person (which includes the good, bad, and the ugly) you miss out on the wholeness that Jesus offers! Jesus knows all the "ingredients" that make up the recipe of your life. He has a healed recipe for your life that will enable you to experience the abundant life He has for you. If we leave the ingredients that Jesus has chosen* for us on the proverbial shelf/counter then we can't enjoy the amazing taste of wholeness.

Remember: His timing is perfect, when He decides that it is time to heal an area in your life then it is time.

**Chosen refers to the certain parts of our past or present that Jesus wants to heal at this particular moment. NOT that Jesus caused or chose for us to go through the suffering/hurt that happened in our past.*

THE PRAYER REQUESTS YOU GIVE TO US:

Prayer requests are placed in a special basket at *The Glennon House* for one month. These requests are prayed for, individually, each day by prayer volunteers. Every week at the Tuesday evening healing service, those hospitalized or in "imminent need" are prayed for by the clergy and all other names, currently in the Prayer Basket, are prayed for aloud by the congregation.
