Healing Thoughts - **God Promises Patience in the Face of Frustration** – Harry Griffith

You created us for Yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You.

We have a friend who has been in a total state of frustration for years. After a painful divorce, she finally found what she thought was the right guy for her, was married to him for a few years and then he left her. Her daughter has had a difficult time finding her place in life and this has frustrated our friend. But the most continuous source of frustration has been her inability to find and keep the right job. She is multi-talented, but something – seemingly beyond her control – keeps her from being in a secure work situation: the company comes on hard times and has to cut back staff, she works her way into a likely promotion and then someone else gets it because of seniority, another company tells her she is ideal for their position but they are looking for someone younger...the list goes on and on. She never ceases trying and she does the best she can with whatever job she has at the moment, but as she looks toward retirement age, she has no pension fund and no health insurance. Frustration!

Frustration is not a new phenomenon; it is as old as history itself. The Bible is full of examples. It was undoubtedly frustration that led Moses to bypass God's instructions regarding bringing water from the rock (Numbers 20:1-13) which resulted in Moses not getting to enter the Promised Land (Deuteronomy 3:21-28). Job experienced bitter frustration over what was happening to him (Job 3:1-26). Jesus was unable to perform any significant miracles in His own hometown because of the disbelief of the people (Mark 6:1-6).

Frustration is something that all of us face. The mild forms of it cross our paths all day long. Here, however, we are concerned about deep, reoccurring frustration or perhaps one major frustration that blocks our path to healing and wholeness. These serious frustrations can lead to precipitous acts – lashing out at others, for instance- that can cause grievous harm to relationships, and even injury to ourselves.

Psalms 27 is attributed to David. He was certainly one faced with frustration. Anointed king at the age of about 16, he didn't actually become king until he was 30. In the meantime, he had to avoid the murderous intentions of his predecessor, King Saul, and later the rebellion of his own son Absalom. He had to "Wait patiently for the Lord" (v.14 NLT). Waiting for God to act when we are greatly frustrated with the way things are going is not easy. God's timing is often different from our own. We can, as a result, become frustrated with God. That kind of thinking implies that God is not any more in control than we are!

If we will accept patience as a gift from God (it is one of the fruits of the Spirit. Gal 5:22), we can deal with our frustration. The two primary qualities needed in order to be patient are inner peace and living one day at a time. Inner peace comes from a stable relationship with God through prayer, Bible reading, and worship. It helps us keep things in perspective and focuses our attention on others and their needs rather than on our own selfish desires. Living one day at a time allows us to experience life at its fullest rather than being frustrated by situations past, present, or future.

THE PRAYER REQUESTS YOU GIVE TO US:

Prayer requests are placed in a special basket at *The Glennon House* for one month. These requests are prayed for, individually, each day by prayer volunteers. Every week at the Tuesday evening healing service, those hospitalized or in "imminent need" are prayed for by the clergy and all other names, currently in the Prayer Basket, are prayed for aloud by the congregation.
