...Perhaps because I had resisted the Lord for a long time, when I accepted Him as my Lord and Savior, I got somewhat serious about my faith. Some months later, I came down with the flu. The aftermath of the illness was worse than the disease, however. I would wake up in the morning feeling okay, but by the middle of the day I would have terrible pains in my lower back, would come home from the office, put a heating pad on my back and go to bed. This was at a particularly stressful time for me. I was an attorney for a large chemical company, and felt I was letting a lot of people – including my family – down while I lay around in pain.

The doctor had told me that I had a kidney infection, and had given me some pills that didn't seem to be doing much good. As I lay in bed one day feeling sorry for myself, an inner voice told me to get out of bed, get on my knees and ask God to heal me. I did and He did! The pain left instantaneously, and I was able to go back to work.

As I reflected on what had happened to me, both then and in the years that followed, I came to believe that physical healing was a way in which God was affirming my faith commitment. Much more important than my relief from pain was a deep conviction that God could be trusted. The wholeness to which God calls us is primarily of a spiritual nature. It is more important that we be in right relationship with God than that we experience physical healing. But, God can do both!

When we think of Christian healing – especially the kind Jesus did in the Bible – we probably think of instances of physical healing. God continues to heal in our day, and we should offer healing as an integral part of the work of the church. But, as we look within the Matthew 9:1-8 passage, we see that physical healing was not the primary purpose Jesus had in mind. He wants to lead us past physical healing to spiritual wholeness.

Physical healing is an important part of Christian healing, but only a part. When someone is injured or sick, we want to pray for God's healing. But in some instances, spiritual healing is more important to God. The physical death rate is 100%; everyone will ultimately experience physical death. What is more important to God, and should be to us, is that the person attain eternal life with God. We should pray for physical healing and spiritual wholeness!

THE PRAYER REQUESTS YOU GIVE TO US:

Prayer requests are placed in a special basket at *The Glennon House* for one month. These requests are prayed for, individually, each day by prayer volunteers. Every week at the Tuesday evening healing service, those hospitalized or in "imminent need" are prayed for by the clergy and all other names, currently in the Prayer Basket, are prayed for aloud by the congregation.
