## *Healing Thoughts* - **God Frees Us From Captivity**– Harry Griffith

*All other freedoms, once won, soon turn into a new servitude. Christ is the only Liberator whose liberation lasts forever. ~ Malcolm Muggeridge*

...People who live with or are closely related to others who are living under addictions (eg. Alcoholism) or strong compulsions are just as captive as the alcoholics themselves. Our lives become ones of trying to make excuses for the alcoholic, picking up the slack (in the home, workplace, wherever) caused by the alcoholic's failures, and trying to reason with a person whose addiction has made him/her unreasonable. We become the victims of "stinking thinking" such as believing that something that has never worked will work if we just try one more time.

Alcoholism is only one of the many forms of captivity people face in life today, however, and God wants us free. Our focus here is on people who are imprisoned by compulsions and addictions, those held captive to sinful behavior patterns. God promises freedom instead of captivity.

We all sin, but when we engage in a particular sin habitually and irresistibly we become captive to that sin. Sin has a way of imprisoning us, controlling us, and dictating our actions. We become slaves to it. In time, our health is destroyed. Alcoholism, for instance, can lead to a variety of illnesses and creates danger for the person suffering from it and those who might get in his/her way. Other compulsions and addictive behavior can lead to emotional, mental, and spiritual breakdown as well as physical disabilities.

Jesus on the other hand, is Truth, and His truth can set us free (See John8:31-36). Jesus is the source of truth, the perfect standard of what is right. It is through Him and His sacrificial death on our behalf that we are forgiven our sins. But, He can also set us free from self-deception and the the deception of satan that would lead us into compulsive and addictive sinfulness. Jesus shows us a better way, the way of truth. Jesus' truth requires us to be honest about ourselves and the captivity in which we find ourselves, and willing to get the help we need.

### **Prayer:**

O God, cleanse me from the evil that would control my life; the addictions and compulsions that would hold me captive; the complacency, rationalization, and hopelessness that would cause me to yield to temptation. Drive these things far from me so that, by willing in all things to do Your will, I may know the truth which shall set me free.

## THE PRAYER REQUESTS YOU GIVE TO US:

Prayer requests are placed in a special basket at *The Glennon House* for one month. These requests are prayed for, individually, each day by prayer volunteers. Every week at the Tuesday evening healing service, those hospitalized or in "imminent need" are prayed for by the clergy and all other names, currently in the Prayer Basket, are prayed for aloud by the congregation.
