The Reverend Nigel Mumford was born and educated in England. He served for six and a half years in Her Majesty's Royal Marine Commandos and continued his education while in the armed forces. His last two years as a Marine were spent as a drill instructor at the Commando Training School.

His conviction to pray for healing came in 1989 when his sister, Julie Sheldon, a ballet dancer with the Royal Ballet in London, was healed by God through Canon Jim Glennon. This was a very dramatic healing from a disease called Dystonia, a neurological condition that curled her up into a fetal position and left her very close to death. Being a witness to her healing has had a profound effect on his life.

Fr. Nigel's love for the healing ministry and his heart for the Lord are expressed in his words: 'Something always happens when we pray.' 'Everyone is healed, some are cured.' 'Take it to the tree.' 'We cannot nail ourselves to the cross; there will always be one nail left!' His personal mission statement is: 'As a drill instructor in Her Majesty's Royal Marine Commandos, it was my job to teach recruits to kill or be killed. It is now a privilege to teach people to heal and be healed. My primary calling is to put people in touch with Christ the Healer, the Lover of souls.'

GIFTS TO: THE HEALING MINISTRY at ALL SAINTS

CHURCH, Winter Park

Healing Thoughts - From the Ashes – Kirsten Aufhammer

One of the questions that Healing Ministry prayer ministers often get asked is, "If God is good then why did He let these bad things happen to me?" There is no pat answer and telling them that "God is good all the time" just won't cut it for most.

Reading through Scripture the other day I came across something in 2 Timothy 4 that caught my attention. Verse 18 makes this promise: *The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and will bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom.* I began to ponder that promise and wonder how it applied to the people who feel as though God didn't rescue them from evil. I looked up the word *safely* in the original Greek and discovered that it is the word **sozo**. The word means to be saved, but it also can mean *to heal or make whole*. In that definition was the answer. *Heal or make whole* – it is through the inner healing of memories that God rescues us from *every evil attack*.

I'd like to share a true story of God rescuing someone from an evil attack and bringing that person into His family.

A young woman, Rhonda, was attacked when she was a teenager. She came to the Healing Ministry for the inner healing of memories. The Lord did miraculous healings in her life, but the attack was never addressed. A couple of years later, Rhonda felt a nudge from the Lord to bring the attack before Him to receive healing. Fear of more hidden memories surfacing tried to dissuade Rhonda from receiving the healing the Lord wanted to do in her. Then she remembered that the Lord had not overwhelmed her with more memories than she could handle before. So, she trusted Him. Rhonda began working with a trained Prayer Minister who walked beside her, in prayer, as she received her healing of memories from the Lord.*

Rhonda recounts that during their prayers a movie appeared in her mind. She saw herself standing in a bathroom looking down at a heap of ashes in the faint shape of a woman - curled in the fetal position. Rhonda knew that she was that heap of ashes lying on the bathroom floor after the attack. She became somewhat concerned, as they continued praying, that the ashes were not disappearing to reveal herself as the woman on the bathroom floor. The ashes remained ashes.

Suddenly, Rhonda was transported to a meadow overflowing with flowers and bird songs. She looked down into her own arms. A beautiful baby girl was staring up at her with blue eyes and a huge grin on her face. Rhonda realized that the baby was herself. The other realization was that the baby was absolutely beautiful. She had never before thought of herself as beautiful. As she looked around her she saw a circle of young girls and women at different ages. She realized that each of the different aged girls and women were representative of her at various developmental stages. The girls and the women turned to stare at the same sight. There walking through a break in the circle was a young woman in garments of flowing white - a crown of flowers on her head. Extending from the flowered crown were ribbons that floated on the wind currents. She was dazzlingly beautiful. Rhonda was overcome with joy and love, her eyes filled with tears as she watched all the other girls and women rush forward to hug the beautiful woman; the one who was once a heap of ashes had been transformed into the woman being hugged. She had been set free from the torment, visually manifested in that heap of ashes, to walk free in the flowing white garments given to her by Jesus.

That is a story of a young woman in whom God fulfilled His promise of 2 Timothy 4:18. She has been rescued from an evil attack and brought safely into His Kingdom. The young woman has been healed and made whole through the inner healing of memories. The good news is that the promise of being *rescued from every evil attack* is available to "whosoever" brings their *evil attack* before the Lord. PS A couple of months later the young woman was reading through the Bible and stumbled across a passage in Isaiah 61 that confirmed the Lord's healing in the most incredible way.

2 to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor
and the day of vengeance of our God,
to comfort all who mourn,
3 and provide for those who grieve in Zion—
**to bestow on them a crown of beauty
instead of ashes,**
the oil of gladness
instead of mourning,
and a garment of praise
instead of a spirit of despair.
