Generational Healing

Tuesday, March 17th @ 5:45 pm in the Church

Do not hold against us the sins of the fathers; may your mercy come quickly to meet us, for we are in desperate need. Psalm 79:8

Very often, behaviors born of sin are passed down from one generation to another. These include addictions, disease, abuse, traumas, and fear. By using a [Genogram](#), which is a family tree, we can list problems we know about in our family background. During a special prayer service, lasting about 10 minutes, we give these ancestral strongholds over to our Lord, to take them, so we can break free of any guilt, burden, and ability to affect us.

Fr. Al Durrance is the Celebrant for the Generational Service, which is held in the Chapel of the Church on the 3rd Tuesday at 5:45 pm before the Healing Service. Please bring a completed Genogram with you to the service. The Genograms are given to Fr. Al prior to the Generational Service. After the responsive reading of the Litany for Generational Healing Fr. Al places the folded Genograms on the High Altar, where they are prayed over during the Healing Service. The Genograms are burned later after the service.

Healing Testimony of Generational Healing:

After asking the Lord what I needed to write down on my Genogram I felt convicted to lift up the alcoholism that runs rampant on both sides of my family. As I wrote AA (the abbreviation for addictive substances) in the boxes of the different family members who I knew where alcoholics, I felt led to place the abbreviation in a box of a family member who I didn't know if she was an alcoholic or not. I went to the Generational Service and handed over the stronghold of alcoholism to the Lord. Two weeks later my aunt called me and told me that the young woman who I had felt led to include as an alcoholic had checked herself into an alcoholic rehab center! Our Lord is amazing and He is faithful to tear down Generational strongholds! ~ IKA

Healing Thoughts - Reputation – Kirsten Aufhammer

Joshua 2:10 (MSG) We heard how God dried up the waters of the Red Sea before you when you left Egypt...

God's reputation preceded him in Jericho. When Joshua sent two spies to check out Jericho, a prostitute named Rahab said, "We heard how God dried up..." God had a reputation in Jericho. The people of Jericho recognized that He was a powerful God even though they had never met Him personally. His reputation was strong enough and believable enough for Rahab to protect Joshua's spies and ask them to promise that her family would be spared.

In Jericho, Rahab's reputation preceded her. She was identified as a prostitute. That is how the people of Jericho knew her.

Jesus' reputation preceded Him. Everywhere He went people followed Him and surrounded Him looking for a miracle. Word of mouth spread the good news of what happened when people met Jesus. Strangers from all over came seeking the One who could heal them.

The blind saw. The lame walked. The sick were healed.

In Nazareth, Jesus' reputation was a stumbling block for those who knew Him the best. His neighbors argued, "Is not this the carpenter's son." (Matt 13:55a) They refused to accept that the Jesus they'd known since birth was in reality the Son of God.

Does your reputation precede you? Mine did.

I was known as a "Unwed Pregnant Teenager," "Alcoholic," and a "High School Dropout." Those closest to me identified me by those labels. They became synonymous with my character. When I was born again seven and a half years ago those closest to me were some of the last to truly believe that Jesus had changed me completely. When one person found out I was returning to school these words were spoken, "Well, I hope Kirsten finishes school this time."

My reputation in my hometown was the hardest and the last to change. Those who had known me prior to my knowing Jesus struggled to believe and let go of the **me** they had once known. I'm so thankful that Jesus understood how much it hurt when they didn't believe in me. I know that He wept right along side me as I cried out in pain at their unbelief.

Jesus proved them all wrong – His neighbors and mine. When we live our lives for Jesus, He heals us and transforms us into the people He created us to be. He doesn't care what our reputation was before we met Him. He sees us as we are today, His children. We might not be perfect, but are reputations are new in Him.

No matter what reputation precedes you (e.g. alcoholic, adulterer, bulimic, divorcee etc.) Jesus has a new identity for you in Him. Don't be discouraged if others (even those closest to you) aren't quick to embrace the new you. Jesus will walk beside you through those times, softening their hearts to see the truth. He makes all things new!

PS Now, Rahab's reputation precedes her as one of the women listed in Jesus' genealogy. "...**Salmon the father of Boaz, whose mother was Rahab...**" (**Matt 1:5**) .

Grief Ministry

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned: the flames will not set you ablaze.....Isaiah 43:2 (NIV)

Come to Me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you. Let me teach you, because I am humble and gentle at heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy to bear, and the burden I give you is light.....Matthew 12:28-30 (NLT)

I find these words of the prophet Isaiah very comforting; yet, when I was in the middle of a life storm they sometimes fell on deaf ears. Sometimes when we are in the middle of coping with a painful loss, we can bounce between knowing the grace of God, wondering where He is, or even wondering if He is real at all. Yet in spite of the pain, confusion, and doubt, we can do more than just survive. With the help, guidance, wisdom, and love of the Lord Jesus we can journey through the valley of the shadow of grief and become new creations (2 Corinthians 5:17). Beloved I pray that God will renew you and give you rest. I know that He can do much more than help you survive your loss; He can teach you to live a new life complete with joy and contentment.
