### Your Healing is Within You by Canon Jim Glennon

*an excerpt from Chapter One: Does God Still Heal Today?*

#### *The promises of God*

If we are going to draw on any gift or blessing from God, no matter what it is, our very first requirement is to know what is available to us; the things God wants us to have. We call this God's will. We have to know what God wants for us, so that our prayers are in harmony with His will. This is brought out in part of the prayer that Jesus taught us, "Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." (p. 27)

#### *Healing by Christ*

What then are the promises of God about divine healing? We will see the answer to that question more clearly if we first remind ourselves that Jesus, in His earthly ministry, showed again and again that it was His will and practice to heal those who were sick. In fact, almost every page of each of the four gospels contains illustrations of how He did this. These stories differ one from another, but each one makes a distinctive contribution to our understanding. They add up to this: Jesus healed, He always healed, He never failed to heal, and He healed them all...

The Bible says that our Lord healed because He felt compassion for people in their need. When the two blind men called out to Him, "Lord, let our eyes be opened," we read that "Jesus in pity touched their eyes and immediately they received their sight and followed Him."

Jesus did not even require that people be forgiven beforehand. Certainly He sometimes ministers the forgiveness of sins *before* He laid His hands on for healing. On other occasions He healed them *first*, then forgave their sins. But very often, he was just content to heal without making any other stipulation at that time. He healed them simply because He loved them and was sensitive to their needs.

Jesus gave another reason for healing when He said, "We must work the works of Him Who sent Me." In other words, healing is what God wants done in the world and it is our responsibility to see it is carried out. Notice how our Lord's statement begins with, "**We** must work..." Though this statement is in the context of a healing that Christ Himself was about to perform, it shows that healing is an assignment given to others as well as to Himself... (pp. 28 – 29)

## *Healing Thoughts* - **Praise Saves** – Kirsten Aufhammer

*Acts 16:22*The crowd joined in the attack against Paul and Silas, and the magistrates ordered them to be stripped and beaten. *23*After they had been severely flogged, they were thrown into prison, and the jailer was commanded to guard them carefully. *24*Upon receiving such orders, he put them in the inner cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

*25*About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. *26*Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everybody's chains came loose.

So here are two men, Paul and Silas, who have been stripped (humiliated in public) and severely flogged. They were then dragged to the jail and harshly thrown into their dungeon prison cell with the dregs of society. They then had their feet thrust into stocks. Can you imagine the physical and emotional pain that they must have been experiencing?

Yet, what does it say that they were doing at midnight? Praying, singing, and evangelizing (the other prisoners were listening to them). This brings new meaning to praising the Lord at all times in all circumstances!

I don't know about You, but when I have a rough week you know what do I often do? Grumble and complain. I hate to admit it, but I have to be honest with you. This is something that I have really been trying to work on, praising God at all times especially during trials! I want to show you this nugget of truth about praise that the Lord reveals in His Word.

Psalm 8:2 (NIV)

From the lips of children and infants  
**you have ordained praise**  
because of your enemies,  
**to silence the foe and the avenger.**

We are all God's children. We need to act more like children and praise Him in the midst of attacks from the enemy so that the foe and avenger will be silenced! Amen. Do you see that awesome promise? God has ordained praise to silence the foe! When we are praising we are shutting out the lies of the enemy!

Look at what happened directly after Paul and Silas prayed and sang hymns of praise:

*26*Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everybody's chains came loose.

The foundations of the prison were shaken. The whole prison was set free! Not just Paul and Silas—it says **everybody's** chains came loose. Everyone was set free by Paul and Silas when they use the ordained praise that God gave them to silence the enemy. When our witness is praise during trials we are evangelizing and spreading the gospel. Our example of praise can set others free from their prisons.

Let's take God up on this promise. Let's make an effort to praise the Lord during our difficult times. Maybe like Paul and Silas we will be set free from whatever prison we are in. Even better, maybe our praises to the Lord will set someone else free!

**Praise Saves!**
