Many years ago, I first discovered, in a personal way, the amazing good news that Jesus still heals people when we pray with them and that He would even heal people through my simple prayers...

...decided to write this little book in order to encourage ordinary people to pray for healing in their families. So many people had been taught that healing was rare or that it would only happen if you were very holy or even that healing ceased with the death of the last apostle. What we rediscovered was healing prayer, this pearl of great price. Instead of buying it, we wished to share it – and share it gladly.

The darker side to this happy discovery of God's healing power was my wonderment at how Christians had come, in large measure, to lose this precious heritage of healing prayer...many Christians simply had not learned to pray with each other at home for anything, much less healing...

At any rate, praying together at home is such a beautiful experience – and so easy to learn that the present bleak record could easily be changed if people were taught and "given permission" to try.

Healing Thoughts - **A Time to Heal** – Dick Mead

What is the one thing poor have plenty of; the rich do not have enough of; we can all share it; but when it's gone it can never be recovered? Give it a little thought before you read on, you may be surprised.

If you have not solved the riddle, the answer is time. Too often I have asked where has all the time gone? That was particularly true when the children were young and we were on vacation. Now those children are young adults out on their own. Or, another example, I was given a project to complete within a certain deadline, which usually was too short. How did the days pass so fast? JoAnn and I have been married 37 years now. Some days it seems like only yesterday we were standing at the altar. How does that elusive dimension escape us? We all have the same 24 hours in a day. Maybe it's because we live in a fallen world where people are obsessed with using days, saving minutes, and trying to find more hours in the day. The fact is we all have all the time that there is, but few of us think we have enough.

Another contributing factor is He who said, "*Before Abraham was born, I AM*" (John 8:58), looks at time with a different stopwatch. When you have existed from eternity past, through the present, and beyond eternity future, the dimension man calls time is irrelevant. We encapsulate it into units of measurement: years, months, days, hours, minutes, and seconds so a finite mind can attempt to understand an infinite God. It's not that our healing needs, physical, mental, emotional, or spiritual are too big. It's our image of God is too small.

Psalm 90 tells us: Lord, you have been our dwelling place throughout all generations.¹ Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.² You turn men back to dust, saying, "Return to dust, O sons of men."³ For a thousand years in your sight are like a day that has just gone by, or like a watch in the night.⁴ . . . Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.¹² Relent, O LORD! How long will it be? Have compassion on your servants.¹³ Satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love, that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days.¹⁴ . . . May your deeds be shown to your servants, your splendor to their children.¹⁶ May the favor of the Lord our God rest upon us; establish the work of our hands for us-- yes, establish the work of our hands.¹⁷

This passage shifts our focus from our time-in-a-bottle bound lives to our eternal God. He created time. He rules and transcends it. When you feel frustrated by the calendar or captured by the clock read Psalm 90. We will be reminded that our days and years are in the hands of our eternal God. As we humbly bow before him we will see time from a new perspective. If we have the right view of eternity we'll know the real value of time.

So what's this have to do with healing? Some healings take, you guessed it, time. Be patient.

" Those who hope in the LORD (wait upon Him) will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." (Isaiah 40:31) "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven: . . . a time to heal (Ecclesiastes 3:1 & 3a)."

THE PRAYER REQUESTS YOU GIVE TO US:

Prayer requests are placed in a special basket at *The Glennon House* for one month. These requests are prayed for, individually, each day by prayer volunteers. Every week at the Tuesday evening healing service, those hospitalized or in "imminent need" are prayed for by the clergy and all other names, currently in the Prayer Basket, are prayed for aloud by the congregation.
