An excerpt: by Fr. Al Durrance

Christian Healing is the process through which the Holy Spirit comes to Incarnate Jesus Christ in our flesh, that we might become His presence for those to whom He sends us in the world for which He died.

We would find that healing is something that we enter when we first encounter the Risen Christ and it continues as we pursue the life that He has called us to live in Him...

**Dear friend, listen well to my words; tune your ears to my voice.**

*Proverbs 4:20*

Years ago, in elementary school, I was the proud owner of a beautiful violin. I loved to draw the bow across the strings enjoying the notes humming against my chin. My least favorite part of playing the violin was tuning it. To tune a violin requires patience and undivided attention, both of which can be daunting for a second grader.

There were a couple of steps that I had to take whenever I tuned my violin. The first of which was that I couldn't rush through the process. Violin strings are under heavy pressure, if you turn the peg too far you run the risk of breaking the string. The next step was to tune the "A" string. Our violin teacher would play an "A" on the piano. Then I would pluck the "A" string gently or draw the bow across it, slowly turning the "A" peg until the sound of my violin matched the piano. I repeated this process with the other three strings until my violin was properly tuned. Depending on the climate (humidity and temperature) of where we were playing, I might have to retune my violin more often. Sometimes, my pegs would slip regardless of the weather and my violin would start to go out of tune. To remedy this problem you can use peg drops. These drops stop your pegs from slipping. The lesson I took away from tuning my violin was that there was a process involved. Once I made it a habit to keep my violin tuned I was able to pick it up and play it whenever I wanted...it was always ready to be played.

I've discovered over the years of walking with the Lord that I need to learn to keep my spiritual ears tuned to hear His voice. I must admit that when I first began listening for the Lord's voice I was often unable to hear Him. I knew that He wanted to guide me through my life, but my ears were more in tune with the busyness of the world around me. Just like with tuning my violin, I couldn't rush the process of tuning my ears to hear the Lord. The process took some time and diligence. I began to seek the Lord first thing in the morning. I made a conscious decision to make Him a priority in my schedule. As I did this it was like my spiritual ears were being tuned to match the exact pitch of the Lord's voice. I began to hear Him speaking to me through His Word. What I was reading in the Bible and devotionals seemed to coincide with what was going on in my life at that specific moment.

I admit that there are days when the climate of my life doesn't seem beneficial to my ears being tuned to the Lord's voice. Stress, sickness, and old behavior patterns sometimes distract me from staying in tune. These times are when I need to retune my ears to listen for what the Lord has to say about the circumstances in my life. When I am tired I really slipped out of tune with the Lord's voice. While my violin needed peg drops when the pegs slipped, I need Holy Spirit drops when I slip. My prayer is that the Holy Spirit would open my ears to hear from the Lord. The Holy Spirit would bring me back in tune.

When I was in second grade I learned to make it a habit to keep my violin always tuned so that I could play it whenever I wanted. I think the same should be true for keeping our spiritual ears tuned into God's voice. If we make it a habit to seek Him, listening for His voice...then we will be able to hear from Him on a regular basis.

I encourage you to tune your spiritual ears to His voice. No matter what circumstance (e.g. illness, loss of employment, death of a loved one, or an addiction) you are dealing with in your life, God wants to talk with you about it. It can seem really lonely/hopeless when you can't hear the Lord's voice over the loudness of the circumstance. Practice tuning your ears to His voice. Allow the Lord to comfort you in the midst of your sorrows.

*Listen for God's voice in everything you do, everywhere you go;  
He's the one who will keep you on track.*
