A LITTLE TESTIMONY

Many years ago, I was in the throws of a painful muscular disorder. It had disrupted my life for six months. I noticed in the church bulletin that a healing prayer group met each Wednesday and I went to see what it was all about. I found a group of loving women who prayed for members of the parish. I joined them each week for three months but never told them of my need or asked for healing prayer. My thoughts ran along the misguided lines that I was being punished for my sins. Nevertheless, I loved being there where the Holy One was very much in evidence.

Along came Christmas Eve morning of that year, and I was unprepared in every way. I called the Convener of the Prayer Group and asked her to pray for me, as I was at a very low point in handling my pain. She was surprised to learn that I was suffering and had never asked for prayer before. With an outpouring of love and warmth, she assured me she would start praying for me immediately and that she would call the other members and ask them to pray also. The fact that these special people were dropping everything and praying for me on one of the busiest days of the year, sent the warmth of Christ throughout my body, soul and spirit.

After that one phone call request, the pain left my body completely. It never returned. I was healed by the power of Jesus and the devotion of the prayer partners who work for Him. The astounding beauty of being healed, the mystery and love of it, were overpowering. I only wanted to know of a way I could pass along this wonderful gift to others. I read and studied scripture, attended healing services, missions and prayer groups. I made mistakes. The main one was seeing myself as some sort of emergency team for God, plunging ahead, scaring people more than leading them to Christ.

Little by little, I've learned to wait on the Lord; always to be waiting and listening. When our time comes to do His work, wherever it may be, He will open doors and lead the way beyond anything we could ever dream up.

To me, God's healing grace is like a great river which spreads out overflowing the savanna, covering the low places in our lives and spreading beyond to the unknown. We know very little, but fortunately God knows; yes, God knows it all.

Every week at the Tuesday evening healing service, those hospitalized or in "imminent need" are prayed for by the clergy and all other names, currently in the Prayer Basket, are prayed for aloud by the congregation.
